1. ONE-SENTENCE HOOK

3. THE STORY STRUCTURE (ACT BY ACT)

ACT I - Discovery

Dr. Tin finds strange nanostructures in a comatose patient's brain.

He digs deeper, forming a secret team to investigate what appears to be a universal, intelligent pattern across all life forms.

ACT II - Awakening Experiments begin. A volunteer (Dr. Saleh) experiences transcendence. Others follow. Each comes back broken or reborn. Meanwhile, members of the team start dying under mysterious circumstances, and evidence of a government cover-up emerges. Tin hides the truth, and eventually, we discover he has already been "inside" and is no longer fully himself.

ACT III - Revelation The team uncovers Tin's dark transformation. He's been killing those who glimpsed the light he could not reach. Saleh and a priest (Father Antonie) try to redeem what's left of him, but a final descent into madness and a police investigation unveil the truth: the real virus isn't biological it's spiritual. And it's inside us.

ONE-PAGE SYNOPSIS

Dr. Tin Douglas, a gifted neurosurgeon, believes he's found the answer to a coma case that defies medicine. But the scans reveal something far stranger: non-organic, geometric nanostructures embedded inside the patient's brain not viruses, not tumors, but something alive. And they're everywhere. In every patient. Every plant. Every life form.
