Structure:

Setting: Lincoln Abe High School

Owens feels like he lives in a luxury, but it was temporary that both had to study and do their process of getting their science project done. Jeff was cooking up some snacks for both. Owen's wants to goto the bathroom, so he sneaks into the Professor's bedroom then later go near the inside of the closet and found out theres a hidden door that leads to a secret lab. James later found something within the lab, and he took it for his own interest.

Logline:

In the near future, television and hip-hop aficionado Jive Owens jumps into and out of TV programs and films while helping his detective friend rid Seattle of a certain breed of criminal.

Brief Summary:

Television fan and hip-hop lover Jive Owens steals a matter converter from the basement of a friend's home. After stealing the apparatus, Jive realizes that he can enter and manipulate television shows and movies; this ability makes him famous. He also helps Detective Johnny Blaze catch the evil Junior Mafia and its nefarious leader – robbers and killers all. Because Jive wears a mask, the cops and victims don't know who is coming to their aid, and Jive can slip back into his fulltime job of controlling the media.

Synopsis:

Manhattan born JIVE OWENS resides in the suburbs of northwest Seattle, Washington. For much of the eighteen years of his life, he has been raised by a single mother, a bank teller named CYNTHIA. He loves classic television and western programs, as well as law oriented and sci-fi shows. He also is interested in rap and hip-hop, and writes his own lyrics. Jive is a little standoffish and therefore has few friends. A senior at Lincoln High School, he makes decent grades and excels in physics. The physics teacher MR. JOSIE assigns JONATHAN JACOBS to be Jive's partner for a science project. Jonathan gives Jive a tour of his house, and Jive notices how organized and focuced on homework Jonathan is. The two work on their physics project and consume snacks. Jive excuses himself to go to the restroom, but he instead sneaks into the basement of the Jacobs's home. There he finds a secret lab in which a matter converter device sits among other scientific equipment. He pockets the device and returns to Jonathan's bedroom, behaving as though nothing unusual has occurred.

Professor JOHN JACOBS, Jonathan's father, returns home and immediately engages in an argument with his son. Jive slips out the door, the matter converter still on his person. Meanwhile, TWO MEN with JMF scrawled on their jackets enter the Jacobs's home, take the father and son hostage, and demand something besides money to take with them. They know about the matter converter and the other scientific appliances, and they snatch all that they can. At this point John and Jonathan realize that somebody else has stolen the matter converter. They have little time to think about this because the people in the JMF jackets shoot them dead. Jive meanwhile plays with the matter converter and causes objects to disappear. He then uses the converter to rob a local bank and throw the authorities off of his scent. The converter accidentally zaps Jive, but he wakes from his unconscious state and assumes that everything is fine. He feels all right and the converter is marred, but likely fixable.

As all of this is going on, Detective JOHNNY BLAZE investigates the slew of deaths around Seattle, Washington, and whether the Junior Mafia (JMF) has anything to do with these crimes. Jive, a friend of Johnny's, notices how angry Johnny is to hear that the members of the Mafia are selling PCP by the local grocery stores. Johnny and another cop trail the Mafia kids, but the SECOND COP and an INNOCENT KID wind up dead during the stakeout. A masked Blaze heads to a restaurant where several JMF members have held INNOCENT CITIZENS hostage. Captain CARAL JUSTICE and Sergeant WILLIAM THOMAS arrive as backup officers. They learn that the man in charge of the villainous behavior is the terrorist and large scale thief ZEONAR. He and his crew have shot at several officers, but twelve survive the onslaught of bullets. Jive, wearing a mask, helps to dismantle the bomb that threatens to blow up the hostages. He also saves a young woman named SEA by throwing a tape toward a gun pointed at her.

Jive returns to his house, sleeps for a little while and then turns on the television to a zombie movie. He enters the realm of the movie and comes face to face with the zombie on the screen! He runs, and as he looks at his surroundings, he figures he must be in a rural location like Kansas. Jive finds no dial tones in the phones and no humans; he sees only zombies, and attempts to defend himself with a stick. Since he is in a grocery store, Jive uses surrounding props like a cash register to bash in the zombies' heads. He escapes the store and sees a brick that states the name of the city: Jamaica, Queens Boulevard. He soon picks up another stick-like object, but it turns into a snake that worms its way around his arm and into his head. The undead begin pushing forth from the ground. Jive pleads for guns to defend himself, and the weapons appear in his hands. He escapes the zombies and returns home though a gateway in the alternate television realm.

Jive appears to be transported to another universe, this one resembling a fetid bathroom. There is a CREATURE in the rest area that seems to be mangling human bodies sprawled out on the floor. The creature turns out to be a werewolf, and Jive tries to hide himself from the beast. Jive is investigated for the bathroom deaths. Dogs and their OFFICER OWNERS chase Jive as he flees the authorities. Meanwhile, the werewolf can hide and deflect bullets the way no normal wolf possibly could. He eventually perishes, and Jive feels content that he was able to transport himself into a werewolf movie. He returns to the real world and answers his mother's call to get a container of Pepsi from the local store. Jive has Johnny Blaze's Jeep, and he climbs in the vehicle with his newly repaired matter converter in tow. At the store, Jive sees that a hostage named MALCOM has been bound and gagged by the Junior Mafia. After Malcom is released,

Zeonar appears and tries to get the matter converter from Jive. As Jive flees from the scene, the news reports declare that a supermarket – the one Jive just exited – is under surveillance, a bank has been robbed and a teenaged girl named BRANDY has been killed by the JMF in the vicinity of both establishments.

Jive has a bag of money in his backpack when he heads home. Meanwhile, the cops arrest the Mafia and immigrants in the supermarket. Jive has escaped the direct eye of law enforcement, but he resents the fact that cops seem to think that he is the cause of so much trouble. LEA – one of the hostages from earlier – has turned her fifteen minutes of fame into various movie and television auditions. The boys at her school also begin talking to her more often, and Lea declares that a masked man – Jive – saved her from the foes. Jive escapes his problems by entering an episode of the television show *Sanford and Son* starring Redd Foxx. He then transfers himself into an action film and lands smack dab in the middle of an automobile chase. In this realm, he also defends a nerd from a vicious bully. Jive discovers a television set in this alternate world and transports himself back to his own universe.

A woman named JOLENA visits the principal of the school to ask about the students who recently have been hostages. On television, the talk show host RICKI LAKE is discussing hostage situations, and Jive jumps into that channel to listen to the host's views. He exits the show and returns to the school's cafeteria. The academy is abuzz about Lea's stint as a captive, and Jolena and other reporters and television newscasters want to talk to her. Even Lea's teachers chitchat about the hostage situation and Lea's bravery, and Lea's fellow classmates ask for autographs from her. Jive watches a brawl play out in the cafeteria, witnesses the flirtations of his classmates and then joins his friend MIKE for a late afternoon Chinese food run. Later he watches *The Andy Griffith Show*, followed by *Unsolved Mysteries* and *Star Trek*.

Jive decides to jump into the movie *The Planet of the Apes*, and finds himself in the middle of a jungle in which prisoners are being taken hostage. He taunts and sidesteps the annoyed apes until he gets bored and decides to exit the film. He then returns to his own universe and begins taking out dozens upon dozens of films and television shows; he inserts himself into all of them. He starts making his own shows, referring to himself as Mindbogler, and he sells the tapes at school for two dollars each. Eventually his shows hit shelves in DVD stores as well as little parking lot kiosks. All of the major television networks want Mindbogler, and Zeonar gets wind of this and becomes jealous. Zeonar's media empire is growing weak, while Jive's gets bigger and bigger. Jive's Mindbogler persona hits the interview circuit and develops fans all over the world. People are intrigued by his ability to go into television shows and movies and manipulate the plots. Jive can even enter crime footage to see the perpetrators of bad deeds, as he does with a kidnapping and robbing video involving Lea and her friend KAREEM. The Junior Mafia is behind the dirty deeds, and they have kidnapped the two innocent victims.

Zeonar and his JMF cronies ensnare Lea and Kareem, and Detective Blaze releases them from their bondage. The detective hears Zeonar plotting to rob a nearby bank and – with Jive as backup – holds the JMF team up at gunpoint. Detective Blaze is temporarily knocked unconscious by the enemy, but he revives. With the help of a masked man (Jive), the detective guns down some of the JMF folks and puts others – including Zeonar – behind bars. Neither he nor the duo of Lea and Kareem know that the masked fellow is actually Jive. Jive pats himself on

the back for a job well done and then returns to the television to entertain his at-home audiences. Jive throws himself into a piece of adventuresome media and alters the plot to his and his viewers' satisfaction.

Comments/Suggestions for Adaptation:

MINDBOGLER presents an interesting concept: a young man existing in a near future world can enter and manipulate the plots of television shows and movies. In addition, he fights real world crime while wearing a mask to obscure his identity; this is intriguing stuff. At present, however, the concept's two ideas don't coexist well within the narrative. One doesn't quite understand why Jive helps stop crimes, much less cover his face while doing so. Presumably he is doing it because he has the apparatus that the robbers covet for themselves – the matter converter – and he wishes to defend the object from those who might perform evil deeds with it. However, Jive uses the converter to perform less than moral acts. In addition, the taking of the converter from its rightful place is a crime and causes two innocent people to die. It's difficult for a reader to understand why the protagonist does what he does. As a result, it's also difficult to identify with or connect to the character in any way.

The story that flows from the concept proves muddy and, on occasion, hard to comprehend. The reader doesn't understand why Jive would steal the matter converter or how he plans to use it. In addition, the episodes of playtime with the matter converter don't seem to have much to do with the crime episodes in which the hero involves himself, nor do they connect to the sections during which Jive enters and exits various shows. It seems like three separate stories are struggling against each other in a slim sixty-nine page book. It's not clear whether the writer intends to focus on Jive's plans for the matter converter, his work as something of a secret crime fighter, or his growing career as a media manipulator. In addition, some of the crime passages and the forays into film and television are so complicated that it becomes difficult to follow the plotline. One can't quite figure out what Jive is doing at any given moment. The reader needs to be able to follow Jive's actions because he is the reader's window into this world. One must in some way or another identify with him.

As presently written, the protagonist's behavior makes little sense and his supporting cast is not very well developed. One doesn't understand why the hero behaves in the manner he does. What is his motivation for stealing the matter converter, and how does he even know where and what it is? How does the converter allow him to enter and exit television shows, and how does a career evolve out of this talent? What possesses him to stick his nose into dangerous situations, and where does he get the knowhow to overpower a force as mighty as the Junior Mafia is said to be? The reader doesn't get a clear sense of what motivates any of Jive's decisions and actions. It's also difficult to discern Jive's character arc. How do Jive's experiences transform him from the

person he is at the beginning of the book to the person he is at the end of the book? Part of the problem is that there are so many – perhaps too many – big life experience in the narrative, and none of them truly affect Jive in any emotional or personality-altering way. It would behoove the author to flesh out the main character so that the reader understands his wants as well as the way in which his overcoming of a problem reveals his true human needs. It would also help the narrative if the characters surrounding Jive were made more multidimensional and relatable.

MINDBOGLER has an interesting concept and some unique narrative threads. However, as currently written, the threads don't come together into a comprehensible plot and the protagonist's actions don't make much sense. The characters need to be further developed, and the plot elements need to come together in a more unified way. At present, the book seems like three separate stories with three different versions of Jive starring in them. Once the narrative possesses a comprehensible arc and the protagonist's actions make a bit more sense, the book may have more potential as a screen adaptation.
