SYNOPSIS

The Epoch Theatre, once London's grandest stage, is now abandoned and slated for demolition. Unknown to the city, five ghostly divas haunt the theater, refusing to leave the stage they once ruled. When Grandpa Clive (the new night watchman), brings his grandson Ben to visit, the ghosts beg for help. Ben proposes a benefit show to raise money to save the theater. Not only do the ghosts' over-the-top antics and Ben's struggles with school play rehearsals make the plan a chaotic mess, but the theater's ruthless owner hires a ghost hunter to rid the place of its inhabitants.

The spirited divas pull off a dazzling performance, but just as hope rises, the owner arrives with a wrecking ball. As the ghosts race to uncover a hidden treasure that could save the theater, they find it just in time to stop the demolition. With the theater saved, the divas revive their careers, and Ben takes center stage in his school's play—this time, confidently on his own.

CHARACTER BIOS

BEN BUTLER protagonist.

A clumsy yet big-hearted teen with dreams of the spotlight, Ben struggles with stage fright and a lack of talent. When he discovers the ghostly residents of the Epoch Theatre, he's thrust into a daring mission to save their home. Along the way, Ben uncovers his hidden courage, juggles chaotic rehearsals, and learns what it truly means to take center stage—both in life and on the stage



THE GHOSTLY DIVAS

Together, they represent the glory days of London's stage, each bringing their own flair and larger-than-life personality to the group. While they often clash over creative differences, their shared love for the theater unites them in their mission to save their home. Among them, Sir Ivan Frothmire and Gwen Oberon are the most prominent, with Sir Ivan's theatrical guidance pushing Ben toward greatness and Gwen's unresolved emotional ties to the theater and her late husband fueling key turning points in the story.



HAROLD HYDE - A brilliant but ruthless theater producer, Harold's ghost still lingers at the Epoch, the home of his theatrical triumphs.



DAME FAYE FINCH - The former grand dame of the London stage, Dame Faye has a regal and commanding presence.



STUMPY LUMPY - A once-beloved headliner comedian.



VIOLA ABBOTT – An American singer/dancer from the flapper age, formerly known as the toast of London.



GWEN OBERON -

A once-revered dramatic actress whose tragic death tied her spirit to the Epoch Theatre, Gwen's elegance hides deep grief and unresolved emotions, especially regarding her late husband, Clive. As the story unfolds, Gwen helps Ben discover his strength, while also seeking closure for her past.

SIR IVAN FROTHMIRE -

A pompous Shakespearean actor who takes it upon himself to mentor Ben, Sir Ivan possesses him and pushes him to theatrical greatness. His dramatic flair and obsessive passion for the stage often clash with Ben's reluctance, but his guidance is essential in helping Ben find his courage.



GRANDPA CLIVE -

Recently hired as the night watchman during the Epoch Theatre's final days, Clive returns to the crumbling playhouse where his late wife, Gwen Oberon, once graced the stage. Initially skeptical of the ghosts, he soon becomes an unlikely ally, rediscovering his love for the theater and proving it's never too late for second chances.



MISTER ZIMMER -

Antagonist, Property Developer / Theater Owner. Marvin Zimmer is a stocky, middle-aged businessman with a balding head and a rumpled, ill-fitting suit. His gruff voice and lack of warmth in his eyes give him an intimidating demeanor. Focused solely on profit, he views his properties as investments and dismisses sentimentality or opposition with a condescending attitude.



ZOEY KNIGHT, GHOST HUNTRESS -

Zoey Knight is a heavy, snack-obsessed ghost hunter with an inflated sense of her abilities. Despite her complete lack of paranormal perception, her boundless confidence and determination keep her on the hunt for supernatural phenomena... until she actually encounters some.



MISTER PHIPS -

A sharp, meticulous assistant to Marvin Zimmer, with a lean build and a precise, orderly appearance. He is professional and loyal, always quick to carry out Zimmer's orders with a cool, almost robotic efficiency.



THE WORLD

The story unfolds in the Epoch Theatre, a once-grand but now crumbling London playhouse, abandoned and slated for demolition. Despite its decay, the theater exudes timeless charm, with faded velvet seats, dusty dressing rooms, and an aura of forgotten magic.


TARGET AUDIENCE


